

Dear Dr. Armstrong:

Thank you for your letter of January 19, 1983, requesting information regarding Sentry Dog Ordinances from the City of Los Angeles. I have enclosed a copy of Section 53.64 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code relating to the regulation of Sentry Dog Trainers.

This Department does appoint an examining committee to ascertain suitable qualifications for applicants for Sentry Dog Licenses. However, there is no provision for us to conduct training programs for these applicants.

In addition, because of political boundary line limitations, we recommend forceful statewide legislation be sought to further strengthen and broaden policies in this field. A copy of such legislation recently enacted by California is enclosed.
